From The Desk Of... Don Smith, Manager

Where ever you put your mark, whatever your opinion, I hope you voiced it! I personally am grateful for this great nation and the freedoms we are able to enjoy, such as the right to vote!

Speaking of voting, we are beginning to gear up for our Annual Membership Meeting, scheduled for March 15, 2017! In addition to the director elections this year, we will also be presenting some recommendations for changes to the Association By-Laws. As I mentioned last month, this process has included a complete review of the By-Laws by several board members, staff members, and our attorney, Steve Sherard, over the last several months and comparison to Wyoming state statutes, as well as best practices. We will be reviewing these recommendations at area meetings scheduled for December at various locations in the territory. The dates, times and locations for these area meetings are listed in this edition of the WREN.



At the area meetings this year, we will be discussing the upcoming rate increase. We are doing our best to keep the increase to a minimum. As part of the assessment of the rates, we completed a new Cost of Service Study (COSS) for the overall system. This COSS looks at the Association's cost on all the various rate classes, and calculates what it costs to serve the average of each class. This COSS shows that this year, we should not see the significant adjustments we saw last year when needed to change the method we charged for the different components of your bills; this year should be more simplified percentages. We will have the details and examples of these adjustments to the different rate classes at the area meetings.

After this election I think I am going to be a little retrospective...This is a very dynamic time in the utility industry and the country as a whole. In my career I have never seen such a volatile period with no end in sight. Historically, the electric utility industry has been very stable, even to the point of being stagnant, and maybe that is one reason why we are seeing so much volatility now. We have been poised for change. Electric utilities have been extending power to consumers for over 100 years and we still string virtually the same type of wire to the same type of wood poles as we did back then. Electricity is still, for the most part, generated by turning wires inside a magnet. The fuel to turn the wire may vary, but it is the same basic method we have done for over 100 years. While these are tried and true methods, and they still work, there is always room for improvement and we need to be aware and be willing to look at new methods and materials. As with any impending change I have always felt that it is best to be part of the process than to have to take what others throw at you. One way to say this is that "It is better to be at the table than on the menu." We will continue to do our best to look for options and ways to provide input to this change and ensure we are doing whatever we can to protect and serve you, our member-owners.

I want to wish you all a very joyful Christmas and prosperous New Year! With the closing of the year on the calendar, we are busy working on getting ready to close the 2016 books, year-end process for the computer system, and of course, preparing for the annual meeting.

This year our annual meeting will be held Wednesday, March 15, 2017. We have two board members up for re-election. We will again have the Wellness Fair for our members. More information on the annual meeting will be forthcoming as we head closer to the date.

One of the difficult changes is a rate increase. Tri-State Generation and Transmission is looking at approximately a 4.6% rate increase to us. The Board is working diligently in making this increase work. As always, if a rate increase is approved by the Board, you will be notified. We know that it seems that the only thing happening here is the fact that your rates are increasing each year. Please know that we are well aware of it and understand your concerns. Unfortunately, an increase of 4.6% cannot be absorbed by this cooperative without some rate influx. Changes in the energy industry, EPA regulations, and industry-related increases in expenses is forcing Tri-State to invoke this rate increase to us.

Something that the Board has been working on that isn't really a change, but more of an upgrade, is the revision of our Articles and By-Laws. We will be holding area meetings to go over these revisions. This process was more of a "cleanup" of wording to comply with state statutes, and other small details. The area meetings will include a question and answer period, and you will vote on the revisions at the annual meeting. Again, please watch for more details and information on when and where.

Budget....such a simple word and yet it makes my job adventuresome at least. Our 2017 budget is without a doubt going to be difficult (at best) to maintain and be able to implement successfully.
